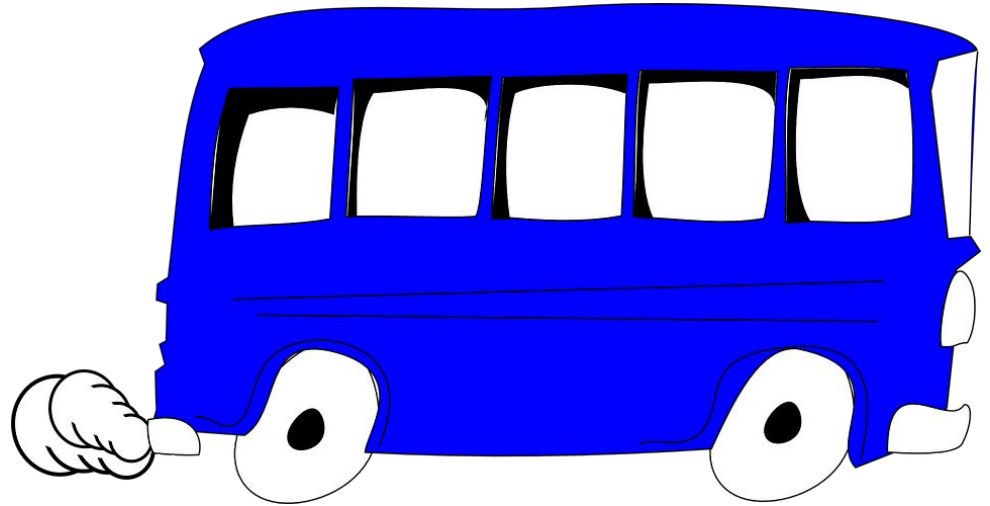

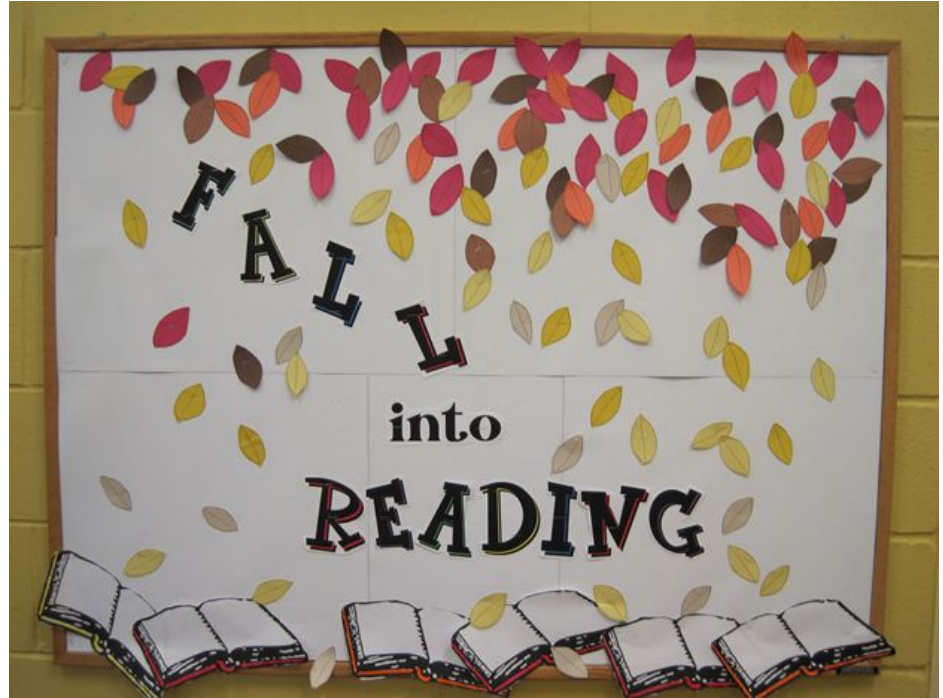
LIBRARY NEWS
